Considering these dynamics, this workshop focuses on the paradigm shifts resulting from the relationship between new service technologies and social needs, from the perspective of regional urban policy and planning in France and Japan. The aim of this workshop, in particular, is to study public and private efforts in France and Japan to bring or accelerate shifts in sustainable urban society. We will consider how new technologies and services interact with civil society from the perspective of regional planning and urban policy at different paces.
